

# **BOKAJAN COLLEGE**

#### **ACADEMIC REGULATIONS FOR H.S. COURSES, 2025**

#### I) Compulsory Subject

- There will be 6 compulsory subjects in total for all students.
- Subjects to be taken in each stream are divided in groups namely A, B & C.
- ◆ A Candidate Shall opt all the Core subjects listed under part A and Elective subjects listed in part B & C as specified.
- ♦ In addition to the 4 (four) elective subjects, a candidate shall have to compulsorily study Environmental Education in class XI and General studies in class XII for 50 marks each.

#### II) Pass Marks for H.S. Final Year Examination

- ♦ The minimum pass marks is 33% of the total mark for all subjects.
- ◆ For a subject having practical/project parts the minimum pass marks shall be 33% of the marks allocated to the theory part and 33% of the marks allocated to the practical/project part.
- ♦ In H. S. course curricula, the student must have to appear in 6[six] subjects and the result will be declared as PASS, only if the students will secure 33% of marks in aggregate, in spite of the fact that even if he fails in one subject. However, passing in English and MIL/Alt Eng. is compulsory.

#### Four Year Undergraduate Course (ARTS)

- 1. Discipline Specific Core (DSC) (English, Assamese, Economics, Sociology, Education, History & Political Science) any one.
- 2. Discipline Specific Minor (DSM) (English, Assamese, Economics, Sociology, Education, History & Political Science) any two (Except the subject choosen as DSC)
- 3. Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC) Commerce (Marketing for Beginners or Fundamentals of Accounting)
- 4. Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)- English Communication or Assamese Communication.
- 5. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)- Have to be opted either from DSC or DSM-I
- 6. Common Value Added Course (CVAC) To be opted either from (i) Health & Wellness or from (ii) Understanding India.

#### Four Year Undergraduate Course (COMMERCE)

- 1. Discipline Specific Core (DSC)
- 2. Discipline Specific Minor (DSM)
- 3. Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC) Anyone from the following (English, Sociology, Economics)
- 4. Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)- English Communication or Assamese Communication.
- 5. Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)
- 6. Common Value Added Course (CVAC) To be opted either from (i) Health & Wellness or from (ii) Understanding India

### **AUS FYUG PROGRAMME REGULATIONS**

#### 1. Courses:

- (i) Discipline Specific Core (DSC),
- (ii) Discipline Specific Minor (DSM)
- (iii) Inter Disciplinary Course (IDC)
- (iv) Ability Enhancement Course (AEC)
- (v) Skill Enhancement Course (SEC)
- (vi) Value Added Course (VAC)
- (vii) Dissertation/ Project
- (viii) Internship

#### 2. DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC CORE (DSC):

This is the course which is to be compulsorily studied by a student as a core subject to complete a programme in a specific discipline of study.

#### 3. DISCIPLINE SPECIFIC MINOR (DSM):

The courses offered under the main discipline of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Minor Courses. From Discipline Specific Minor, students shall take two subjects related to his/her discipline.

All DSM course shall be stand alone and students can select first minor subject and second minor subject according to their choice.

#### 4. INTERDISCIPLINARY COURSES (IDC):

Three interdisciplinary courses i.e. IDC-101, IDC-151 and IDC-201 with 3(three) credits each shall be studied in the entire FYUG programme in First Semester, Second Semester and Third Semester respectively. For Arts Students IDC will be Commerce and for Commerce students IDC will be any Arts Subject.

IDC courses opted shall remain same for all three semesters. Semester wise change of IDC is not allowed.

#### **5. ABILITY ENHANCEMENT COURSES (AEC):**

Ability Enhancement Courses are the compulsory courses and are based upon content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

For AEC courses, there shall not be any internal exam. Total Marks for AEC examination shall be 50 with two hours examination duration.

#### 6. SKILL ENHANCEMENT COURSES (SEC):

The SEC Courses opted in  $1^{\rm st}$  Semester shall remain same for all three semesters. Semesterwise change of SEC is not allowed. However, in case of change of DSC and DSM subjects in  $3^{\rm rd}$  semester, change of SEC may be considered subject to fulfilment of other conditions. The SEC shall have to be opted from either DSC or DSM-1

#### 7. VALUE ADDED COURSE(VAC):

This is also common to all FYUG students of 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Semester) Students have to OPT any one from the following in 1st Semester (i) Yoga, Health & Wellness or (ii) Understanding India. Environmental Studies are being made Compulsory Course in second semester for all streams.

#### 8. DISSERTATION/PROJECT WORK:

Dissertation Project Work is considered as a special course. For students with Honours and Research, DSC-451 paper shall be Research Methodology and the content of the Course shall be School-specific. However, for other students, DSC 451 shall be a usual 500 level paper.

#### 9. INTERNSHIP/COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT/FIELD WORK:

This is a new and significant component of FYUG programme under NEP 2020. The course is a compulsory 2 credit course for  $5^{th}$  Semester students of all Disciplines under FYUGP as per UGC guideline. In this component there are three alternatives viz., Internship. Community Engagement and Field Work.

**Internship:** Under Internship, all students shall undergo internship/Apprenticeships in a farm, industry, or organization or Training in Labs with Faculty and Researchers in their own or other HEIs/Research Institutions. Students will be provided with opportunities for (A Internships with local industry, business organizations, health and allied areas, local governments (such as Panchayats, Municipalities), Parliament or elected representatives, Media organisations, Artists, Craft persons etc. so that students may actively engage with practical side of their learning in order to improve their employability.

**Community Engagement:** Community Engagement and Service seeks to expose students to the socio-economic issues in society so that the theoretical learnings can be supplemented by actual life experiences to generate solutions to real-life problems.

**Field Work:** This aims at providing students an exposure to development-related issues in (!! rural and urban settings like socio-economic development. This is an opportunity for students to gain understanding of complex socio-economic problems in the community and innovative practices required to generate solutions to the identified problems.

#### 10. RESTRICTION FOR CLUSTERING OF SUBJECTS:

Both DSC and DSM should be selected from either of the clusters. Same subject cannot be selected as DSC, DSM and IDC. Student should opt for two DSM, one as first minor and the other as second minor.

Opting one literature as DSC and other literatures as DSM and IDC are not allowed.

#### 11. PROGRAMME OF STUDY UNDERNEP 2020:

The programme of study is to be called as "Four-Year Under Graduate Programme under NEP 2020" and in short 'FYUG' shall be a 8-semester programme of 4 (four) years' duration and, there shall be 4 types of Certifications based on Exit from the FYUG system *namely Certificate*, *Diploma, Three Years Bachelor's Degree and Four Years Bachelor's Degree with* Honours/Honoursand Research.

#### 12. ADMISSION TO HIGHER SEMESTER AFTER END SEMESTEREXAMINATION:

Admission to immediate next higher semester  $(2^{nd}/3^{rd}/4^{th}/5^{th}/6^{th}/7^{th}/8^{th}$  semester) after each End Semester Examination (ESE) shall be mandatory for each and every student with or without "Arrear Paper/s"

Those students who have enrolled for the End Semester Examination shall be promoted to immediate next higher semester irrespective of pass or fail in the examination except fourth year. Students with arrear paper(s) shall not be allowed to move to 4th years (7th Semester) in any case.

Those students who are interested to opt for Four Years Bachelor's Degree with Honours and Research under FYUG programme should have at least CGPA 7.5 up to 6<sup>th</sup> Semester (3<sup>rd</sup> year) without any arrear paper(s) for admission to 7<sup>th</sup> Semester (4<sup>th</sup> year).

#### **13. ATTENDANCE:**

Each student shall have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/ Tutorials/ Practical classes in each paper of all the courses as per the recommended Course Structure of the concerned programme of study so as to eligible for appearing ESE. of that paper.

Those students who could not fulfill the minimum attendance are NOT ELIGIBLE for the ESE of that course.

# 14. UNIT TEST A student who failed to secure minimum pass marks(40%) in Unit Test of a paper shall NOT be allowed to appear in the concerned paper in the End Semester Examination (ESE).

#### 2. Identity Card:

Students will get an identity card at the time of admission. They must keep it with them within the college campus. A lost identity card will be replaced by new one on payment of Rs. 50/

#### 3. Students Aid Fund:

The College has a Students Aid Fund to help the needy and meritorious students. Aid is offered both in Cash and kind. Concessional admission is provided to Meritorious students from BPL families.

#### 4. Students Union:

The college has a nominated student's union body. Membership is compulsory for every student. The Governing Body of the college through a resolution has prohibited holding of students Union Elections.

#### 5. Co-curricular Activities:

The college encourage the development of the creativity of the students through various co-curricular activities. Competitions on music, quiz, debate, story writing, essay writing are organized round the year where the students participate actively.

#### 6. Grievance Cell

The College has constituted a 'grievance cell' headed by the Principal to look into and to redress grievances of the college employees and the students.

#### 7. Anti Ragging Cell

'Anti Ragging Cell' is constituted annually to totally prohibit Ragging of students. Ashok Sonar, HoD (Economics) is the incharge of Anti Ragging Cell for current academic session.

#### 8. Personal and Academic Counselling.

Academic Counselling to the students of the college is offered by the teachers as well as invited counsellors as and when necessary. The college maintains homely and friendly teacher-student relation. Students are encouraged to feel free to discuss their academic and personal problems with the teacher and seek advice.


